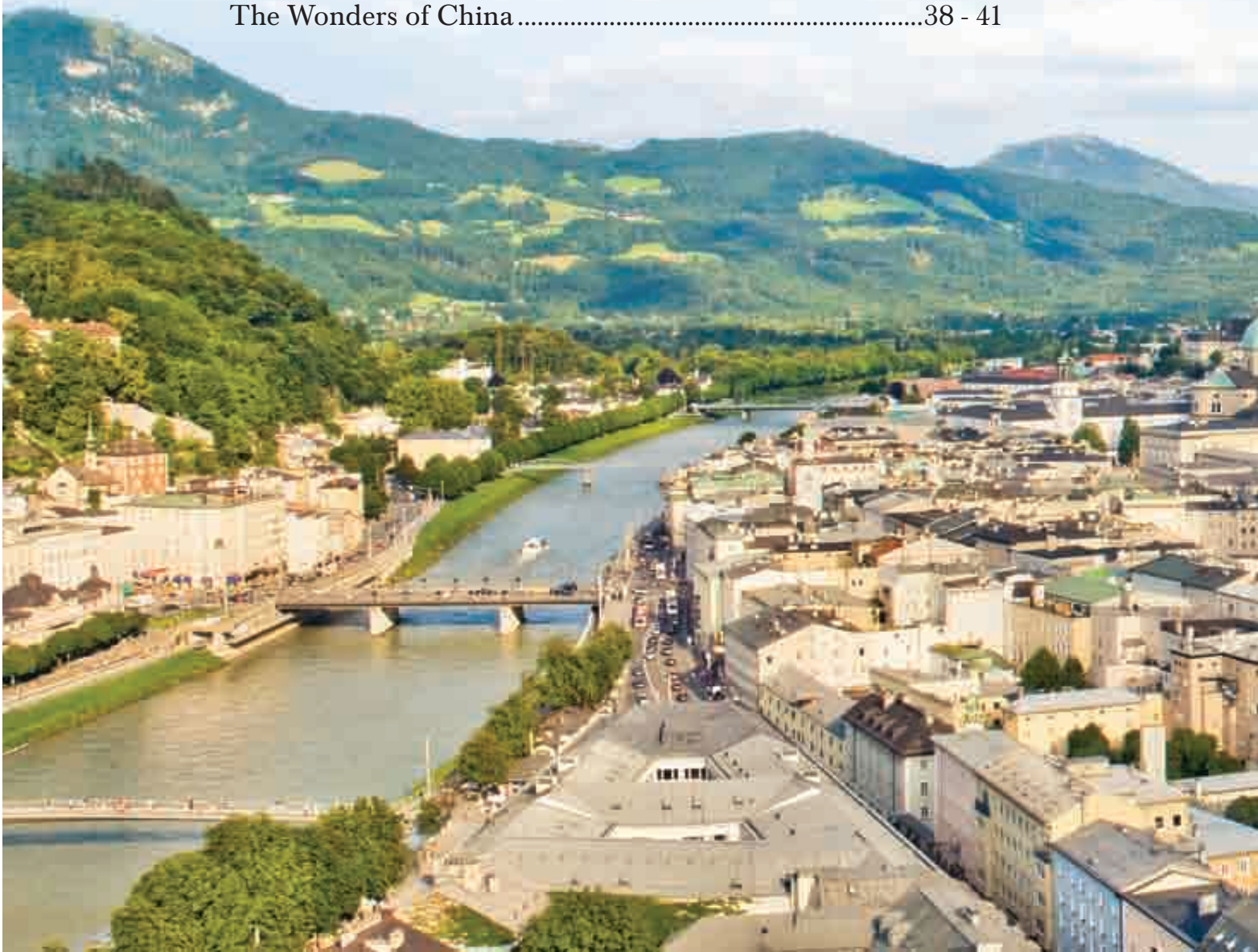

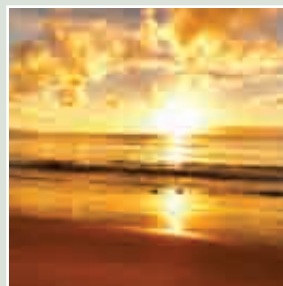

Day 1: Overnight Flight

Day 2: Lisbon, Portugal - Queluz -

Tour Begins Welcome to Portugal! Your tour opens in the historic town of Queluz. Arrive at Pousada de Queluz, a splendid hotel and former residence of the royal guard that sits across the street from the Queluz Palace. Tonight, meet your fellow travellers during your welcome dinner. (D)

Queluz This morning, tour Lisbon, Portugal’s capital. You’ll explore the city’s Moorish Alfama Quarter. See the 16th-century Jeronimo’s Monastery, a UNESCO World Heritage site, and the Monument to the Discoveries, which honours intrepid Portuguese explorers and their patrons. The impressive Belem Tower (UNESCO) stands watch where great navigators once set forth. Later today, set off for the coastal resort town of Cascais. Enjoy leisure time to stroll its cobblestone streets, walk the ocean side promenade or shop for ceramics, lace, hand woven works and tapestries. (B)

Day 4: Queluz - Fatima - Porto -

Ship Embarkation Journey to Porto. Pause along the way at the

world-famous Marian pilgrimage site of Fatima. Continue on to Porto, birthplace of Prince Henry the Navigator. Join a local expert and get to know the city, one of the oldest in Europe. Discover its historic center (UNESCO) including the golden interior of San Francisco Church and Stock Exchange Palace. See the imposing 18th-century Clerigos Tower; the impressive Dona Maria Pia Bridge which was designed by Gustave Eiffel; and the medieval quarter. Conclude with a view of Porto’s stunning skyline. Next, tour a local wine cellar and enjoy a tasting of its famous Port wine.

Then, it’s time to board your ship and settle in for your relaxing 6-night deluxe Douro River (UNESCO) cruise. Meet the ship’s crew this evening during a welcome cocktail reception followed by dinner. (B, D)

Day 5: Porto - Alpendurada e Matos

- Regua Take advantage of the ship’s amenities as you follow the contours of the “River of Gold” lined with the terraced vineyards of one of the world’s oldest wine regions. Stop in the lovely Alpendurada e Matos village for a delightful lunch in the former Benedictine Alpendurada Monastery with spectacular views of of the Douro



River. Then you're off to learn more about the region's culture and wine during a visit to the Douro Museum. A local expert will introduce you to the wine production process and the region's vineyards, ecology and historical heritage. Continue sailing, soaking up the stunning panoramas. Travel through the massive lock at Carrapatello, the highest in Europe at 115 feet, before arriving in Regua for the evening. After dinner, local performers entertain you with classic Portuguese Fado music and popular folkloric dances. (B, L, D)

Day 6: Regua - Vila Réal - Pinhão

Journey to Vila Réal, a charming town situated at the base of the mountainous Serra do Marão and surrounded by terraced vineyards that produce grapes for the famed Port wine. Spend time at the grand 18th-century Mateus Palace and Gardens. Stand in awe of its stunning façade, elaborate gardens and reflecting pond. Your cruise continues, passing vineyards with terraces rising up to 2,300 feet from the river. In the afternoon, learn the secrets of Portuguese cuisine during a fun-filled, interactive cooking class. This evening's dinner is at the 100-year-old Quinta da Avessada, located in the small village of Favaio, known for its famous bread, Port and Moscatel wines. You'll overnight in Pinhão. (B, L, D)

Day 7: Pinhão - Castelo Rodrigo - Barca d'Alva As you glide along the river this morning, admire the views of dramatic rock formations, picturesque terraced vineyards and centuries old towns. Pass through two of the river's locks at the Valeira and Pocinho dams. Make a stop in Castelo Rodrigo, beautifully located at 2,200 feet above sea level with magnificent views of the spectacular Douro River Valley, for a tour. The town is set among almond orchards and its narrow streets are lined with 16th-century houses with distinctively Portuguese Manueline-

style windows. Later, get to know the history of Portugal during an on-board lecture. This evening, enjoy a delightful Captain's Dinner featuring savoury Portuguese cuisine and wines. Your day comes to a close in Barca d'Alva. (B, L, D)

Day 8: Barca d'Alva - Salamanca, Spain - Barca d'Alva, Portugal

Venture out by land to historic Salamanca, one of Spain's most beautiful cities (UNESCO). Salamanca is rich in culture and famous for the University of Salamanca, founded in 1218. Join a local expert to discover the city's Roman, Arabic and Christian architectural treasures and its vibrant Plaza Mayor. Immerse yourself in Spanish culture during lunch featuring a flamenco performance. This evening, savour a typical Portuguese-style barbeque. (B, L, D)

Day 9: Barca d'Alva - Entre-os-Rios

As a local saying goes, "God created the Earth, and man the Douro." Sit back and take in the dramatic vistas as you glide by the terraced vineyards dotted with white villas that plunge to the river's edge. Today, you may choose to attend a discussion on "Portugal Today" aboard your ship. Tonight, enjoy a sunset dinner followed by a vintage port wine ceremony. (B, L, D)

Day 10: Entre-os-Rios - Disembark Ship - Coimbra - Viseu

Say farewell to your ship and continue your journey with a tour of the Vista Alegre Porcelain Museum on the site of a historic factory. Learn the art of hand-made Portuguese porcelain. Continue on to Coimbra and join a local expert to explore this fascinating city that is home to one of the world's first universities (UNESCO). See its Baroque library with 300,000 books, the 12th-century Old Cathedral, and the 16th-century aqueduct. Later, you arrive at Pousada de Viseu,

your luxurious hotel that was once a hospital and dates back to 1842. (B, D)

Day 11: Viseu - Tomar - Palmela

Explore the Convent of the Knights Templar of Tomar (UNESCO). Built in 1160 to defend against the Moors, this stronghold incorporates nearly five centuries of architectural styles. The ornate rotunda is modeled after Jerusalem's Church of the Holy Sepulchre and the Dome of the Rock. The intricately sculpted Window of the Chapter House reveals a wealth of details illustrating Portugal's status as a sea power. Continue to Palmela which lies just south of Lisbon. Arrive at your hilltop hotel, Pousada de Palmela, and behold the outstanding view of the valley below. This serene property was a once a medieval castle that was converted to a convent and has since been transformed into a delightful hotel. (B)

Day 12: Palmela - Evora - Palmela

Travel across the Alentejo region to historic Evora (UNESCO). Experience a true open-air museum inside Evora's medieval walls. A 2nd-century Roman temple to Diana and well-preserved monuments set the scene for your leisurely paced walking tour. Then, have some free time to explore on your own or browse the shops to purchase one of the unique locally-produced items made of cork. End your day with a farewell dinner celebrating the end of an unforgettable trip to Portugal. (B, D)

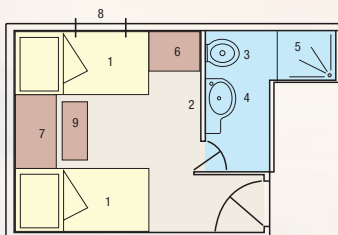

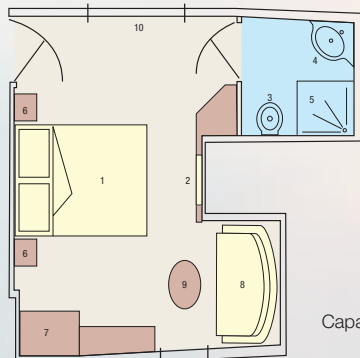

Day 8: Regensburg - Kelheim

Today, arrive in magnificent Regensburg, one of Germany's best-preserved medieval cities. A city walk features the old Town Hall, 12th-century Stone Bridge, St. Peter's Cathedral and the Porta Pretoria. Tonight, the ship enters the first stretch of the fascinating Main-Danube Canal as you make your way towards medieval Kelheim. (B, L, D)

Day 9: Nuremberg Depart on a guided tour of picturesque Nuremberg, Bavaria's second largest city. You will be awed by 900-year-old ramparts, the Imperial Castle and the Justice Palace. Later, continue sailing and arrive at the impressive stair-step locks where you will ascend to the highest point of your cruise. (B, L, D)

Day 10: Bamberg Cruise through the final stretch of the Main-Danube Canal to Bamberg, a UNESCO World Heritage site. Disembark and enjoy a guided tour to discover the history of this medieval gem, founded in 902. (B, L, D)

Day 11: Würzburg Arrive in Würzburg, the "Pearl of the Romantic Road." Nearly destroyed during WW II, Würzburg has been rebuilt into a beautiful Franconian town. Visit fascinating sights including the magnificent Prince-Bishops Residence, a UNESCO World Heritage site. Continue cruising through the pastoral Franconian wine region. (B, L, D)

Day 12: Excursion to Wertheim and Miltenberg Today you disembark for a shore excursion. First, stop in Wertheim, where you will get to know the city on a walking tour through its cobblestone streets lined with gabled, half-timbered houses, followed by a visit to the famous Glass Museum. Next, continue to Miltenberg with time to explore the city including its enchanting market square before returning to the ship. (B, L, D)

Day 13: Rudesheim - Koblenz Cruise along a beautiful stretch of the Rhine. Sail through the dramatic Rhine Gorge, dotted with hilltop castles. You will see the legendary Lorelei Rock before arriving in Rudesheim, a charming Rhine Valley wine town. The "Winzerexpress" mini-train takes you to Siegfried's

Mechanical Musical Instrument Museum for a guided tour. Time is made for you to explore the pedestrian street, Drosselgasse, on your own. Later, cruise to Koblenz, at the confluence of the Rhine and Moselle rivers. Enjoy an early evening walk of this charming town surrounded by vine-covered hills. (B, L, D)

Day 14: Koblenz - Cologne

Cruise the scenic Rhine River to Cologne, one of Germany's oldest cities. A guided tour through the old part of the city highlights the twin steepled, 13th-century Gothic cathedral. Tonight you are invited to attend the Captain's Gala Dinner before departing for the Netherlands. (B, L, D)

Day 15: Amsterdam, Netherlands
