





Day 1: Halifax, Nova Scotia - Tour Begins

Welcome to Canada's Maritimes region – an area of rugged and pristine beauty.

Day 2: Halifax - Peggy's Cove - Halifax

Explore Halifax's charming downtown on a tour of the city highlighting the waterfront, Public Gardens and the Citadel. Later, enjoy a visit to one of the most picturesque spots in all of Canada – Peggy's Cove. Its historic lighthouse overlooking the Atlantic Ocean provides one of the most memorable views you will ever see. This evening, enjoy dinner along the waterfront. (B, D)

Day 3: Halifax - Cape Breton Island - Baddeck

Enjoy a visit to the Glooscap Heritage Centre to learn about the Mi'kmaq heritage and Glooscap legends, see artifacts including stunning quill and bead work, and learn some words from the Mi'kmaq language. Continue your journey along the Canso Causeway to Cape Breton Island. Enjoy a scenic drive by the shores of Bras

d'Or Lakes, Canada's only inland sea.

Upon arrival in Baddeck, explore the variety of inventions on display at the Alexander Graham Bell Museum. (B)


Day 4: Cabot Trail Stop at the famed St. Peter's Church in Cheticamp. Then, explore the Cabot Trail and fall in love with its spectacular views of the Atlantic Ocean. Visit the Acadian Museum to learn how to make a hooked rug. Even more fun awaits as you stop at fishing communities along the coast, including lovely Neil's Harbour. Next, stop at the Gaelic College. Watch North America's first Gaelic language short film: *Faire Chaluim MhicLeoid - the Wake of Calum MacLeod*. Afterwards, learn how the Great Kilt was made during a brief kilt-making demonstration. Learn a few handy Gaelic phrases and join in the fun of a milling frolic. Practice a Gaelic song while sitting around a table and beat a large loop of woolen cloth in rhythm. This evening, savor a taste of Cape Breton with dinner featuring local flavors, music and a historic show of

this region. Later, we've arranged an old-fashioned bonfire (weather permitting) with music. It's the perfect chance to dance the night away under the stars. (B, L, D)

Day 5: Baddeck - Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island

This morning, enjoy a short ferry ride to Prince Edward Island. Upon arrival, venture to seaside Charlottetown for a walking tour along its narrow streets lined with quaint homes and hidden treasures. This evening enjoy a demonstration dinner with a local chef showcasing the flavors of the island in a four-course culinary masterpiece, prepared right in front of you. Of course Prince Edward Island blue mussels, island berries and local tenderloin will be among the items you will be able to taste. (B, D)

Day 6: Prince Edward Island Today you will come to know the landscapes of Prince Edward Island, the backdrop of the novel, "Anne of Green Gables." Visit Rustico's celebrated wharf dotted with fishing boats and lobster traps. Arrive in



Cavendish and visit Cavendish National Park's picturesque beaches. Visit the Anne of Green Gables House. At Prince Edward Island Preserves, see local berries blended with a "secret" ingredient to create a unique island taste. (B)

Day 7: Charlottetown - Saint John, New Brunswick This morning, leave Prince Edward Island as you cross the Confederation Bridge. Travel along the shoreline to the amazing Hopewell Rocks. A New Brunswick icon, these flowerpot-shaped rocks seem to rise four stories high at low tide only to disappear into tiny islands when the tide is high. Enjoy a maritime lobster feast as you look out upon Daniel's Flats. An expert teaches you how to crack and eat lobster like a local. Continue your journey through New Brunswick to the city of Saint John. (B, L)

Day 8: Saint John Explore the Fundy Trail, marveling at the views of the famous tides. You can even sample Fundy seaweed! Journey to Hearst Lodge, a remote fishing lodge accessible only by 4x4 vehicles, for an exclusive salmon barbeque! Before returning to the city, view some of St. Martin's famous covered bridges. The evening is at leisure in the city of Saint John. (B, L)

Day 9: Saint John - Western Shore, Nova Scotia Experience local life at the Saint John City Market as it comes

alive with the aroma of fresh food. Later, board a ferry bound for Digby, Nova Scotia. Harborfront accommodations await in charming Western Shore. Upon arrival you may wish to stroll along the beach with views of Oak Island, home of a pirate's treasure still waiting to be found. (B)

Day 10: Western Shore - Lunenburg - Western Shore Visit the fishing village of Mahone Bay before stopping at Amos Pewter to learn about the intricate artistry that goes into each piece. Next, travel along the Lighthouse Route towards Lunenburg. Explore this fishing village and discover how early settlers turned to the sea for survival. Visit with a local fisherman to learn all about scallops and how to shuck them! Next, return to the days of Rum Runners and prohibition. Lunenburg was once the center of "bottle fishing." Complete this experience with a tasting at the Iron Works Distillery. Also, enjoy a visit to the Fisheries Museum where you may choose to try its marvelous touch tank. Start your evening along the waterfront sampling local mussels, oysters, and their world-famous scallops prior to a spectacular farewell dinner. (B, D)

Day 11: Western Shore - Tour Ends Today you depart the Maritimes, taking home countless memories. (B)



Day 1: Calgary, Alberta - Tour Begins

Beginning in the Canadian province of Alberta, your tour combines the best of the prairies, the majesty of the Canadian Rockies, and the beauty of Montana’s Glacier National Park, giving you a superb overview of these U.S. and Canadian wonderlands.

Day 2: Calgary - Waterton Lakes National Park

Day 3: Waterton Lakes National Park - Glacier National Park - Waterton Lakes

Today you’ll explore Glacier National Park. A naturalist’s paradise, Glacier preserves over one million acres of forests, Alpine meadows and lakes, and is home to over 70 species of mammals and 270 species of birds. Enjoy a drive aboard one of the famous Jammer cars, built in the 1930s, over one of the most breathtaking roads in North America. “Going to the Sun Road” stretches across the Continental Divide and offers incredible views of the valley and Glacier National Park. (B)

Day 4: Waterton Lakes National Park - Banff, Alberta

This morning, relax during your journey to Banff and soak in a backdrop of wonderful wildlife and the majestic Canadian Rockies. Arrive at the grand The Fairmont Banff Springs Hotel,

known as the “Castle in the Rockies,” for a luxurious three night stay. Enjoy leisure time to explore its charm, grace and beauty. (B)

Day 5: Banff Start your day with breathtaking views of Banff’s Sulphur Mountain. Take a gondola ride to the summit where you will enjoy breakfast as you overlook the town and the valley. ACCOMMODATIONS

What is the difference between a twin room and a double room?

In certain countries, hotel rooms tend to be smaller than U.S. standard accommodations. A double room is designed to accommodate two people, but may not have two separate beds. A twin bedded room has two separate beds of any size, and is the type most commonly utilized.

What size is a triple room? A triple room is the same size as a twin bedded room and beds will accommodate three people; but we cannot guarantee that there will be three separate beds. If there are only two beds, a rollaway may be requested but cannot be guaranteed due to size of room and fire codes. This will vary for our Family tours. Please inquire at time of reservation.

Can my children travel on tour? Children over the age of 5 may travel on a Collette vacation accompanied by an adult. Child land rates are valid for ages 5-12, sharing a room with two full paying adults. Children ages 4 and over may travel on a Collette Family Vacations trip, accompanied by an adult. Child land rates for Collette Family Vacations are valid for ages 4-14, sharing a room with at least one adult. If you are traveling with a child, it is your sole responsibility to ensure that the child follows all safety rules of the tour. Please note: A single adult traveling with a child on a Family tour will be charged the single rate.

Are single and triple rooms always available?

On many tours, triple and single accommodations are limited and are available on a first come, first served basis. Be advised that single rooms are often smaller.

When can I check into my hotel? Normal check-in time is late afternoon in most locations. Due to early arrival times into some cities, rooms may not always be available for immediate check-in.

AIR

Can Collette Vacations book our airline reservations? Collette Vacations is happy to assist you in accommodating your flight needs. Due to tour scheduling and limited availability you are strongly encouraged to take advantage of Collette's air packages. We are not responsible for air arrangements you have made on your own. On occasion, it is necessary to change tour dates. In this case, we can only protect air reservations booked through Collette Vacations. For all air reservations, it is strongly recommended to reconfirm flights before departure, in the event that the airline has an unexpected schedule change. We cannot assume responsibility for schedule changes, routings or flight cancellations involving the airlines.

ATTRACTIONS & SIGHTSEEING

Are attractions always available? Access to some attractions or Collette Foundation sites may be affected by the observance of holidays, weather conditions or other circumstances. As a result the days and order of sightseeing may change to best utilize your time on tour. Boat rides are weather permitting. Some attractions may not be available during the "off-season" months. When attractions are unavailable, other similar attractions will be substituted. Wildlife sightings are not guaranteed.

Is there a lot of walking on tour? We pride ourselves on bringing travelers the very best experiences a destination offers. Our itineraries include many activities and may consist of walking on uneven terrain or significant walking at times. Some of the most unique sightseeing can mean accessing locations that restrict motorcoaches, especially in historic areas. Some hotels/lodges in remote locations may not have elevators. For your comfort, we recommend bringing walking shoes. Review each tour's "Tour Activity Level" and "Tour Pacing" (pg 87) for details.

Can you tell me more about the safaris? In order to most fully experience the wildlife, you will be traveling by custom built safari vehicle which requires climbing in and out frequently and sometimes travel on bumpy roads. To experience Africa fully we recommend that all travelers be in reasonably good health and prepare properly.

How can I plan for shore landings? Special clothing is required for the shore landings (Antarctica, Galapagos); please refer to your pre-departure documents for important details.

Are all theatre performances suitable for children? Some theatre performances may be unsuitable for children – consult your Tour Manager.

DOCUMENTATION

Do I need a Passport? Government issued identification is required for all air travel. A valid passport is required for all trips outside the U.S.A. All passengers should check with the appropriate foreign consulate for entry and validity requirements. We recommend that your passport has six months validity, and at least 3 blank pages. Passports and visas are the responsibility of each client.

International Borders Any child under age 16 (traveling without a parent or legal guardian to Canada) must have written permission from a parent or legal guardian.

Please be advised that if you have been convicted of an offense, or have committed a criminal act that is an offense under the laws where it occurred and would be an offense in Canada, you may be inadmissible into Canada. You will need to apply for a Minister's Permit of Approval of Rehabilitation at a Canadian Consulate. All other travelers should contact the appropriate consulate for entry requirements for other international destinations.

EXTENDING YOUR STAY

Can I extend my tour to see more of a region? Yes! You may enhance your tour by purchasing either an extension or pre/post hotel stays, offered on select tours. Extensions may be "hosted" rather than escorted. When hosted, passengers will be greeted upon arrival by a local tour manager who will provide all included services and be available on-call during the duration of the extension. A minimum number of passengers may be required to operate some extensions. Extensions not purchased at time of deposit are subject to availability and applicable charges at time of request.

Collette also offers pre and post hotel nights before and/or after a tour for you to explore the destination independently. Should you purchase additional nights, please be advised that your tour manager will not be available during this time.

EXTRAS

What is not included in the tour price? The land price does not include air travel, airline fees, airport or departure taxes, transfers, visas, customary end of trip gratuities for your tour manager, driver, local guides, hotel housekeepers, cruise ship wait staff, and any incidental charges.

LATE BOOKINGS

Do you accept late bookings? Tour sales normally close 7 days prior to departure. All late bookings are on request and must be guaranteed with a credit card if within 60 days of departure date.

ON TOUR EXPERIENCE

Where do I meet my tour manager? Your tour will begin at your first hotel. The tour manager will make contact with you at the hotel and will provide details relating to your tour. The hotel's address and phone number will be included in your documents.

Can I pre-purchase optional excursions/activities? Yes, the majority of optional excursions and activities are available for advance purchase for applicable tours provided that you make your options purchase prior to 15 days of the tour departure. Collette makes it convenient to reserve pre-sold options by visiting our website for a full listing of activities and excursions or when your reservation is made with our reservations staff. In addition, there are benefits to pre-purchasing options including a price guarantee once your tour is paid in full. So, while the cost of an optional activity may change from the time you book your tour, once payment is received in full, your pre-selected options are guaranteed by Collette at their original price. TOUR PACING

How can I be best prepared for the pacing and physical requirements on a Collette tour? Tour pacing varies by itinerary, and each destination's sightseeing and activities are unique. Pacing is subject to personal interpretation. At Collette, we do include the best a destination has to offer, enhancing your overall tour experience. For overnight pacing of a tour, please refer to the "Accommodations" section on each tour page and on the tour map. These describe the number of nights you will stay in each hotel during your tour. The day by day descriptions will provide additional detail about the number of activities included in each day.

The Tour Activity Level Ranking is featured on each tour itinerary in a green circle. The definition of each activity level is listed here. If you have additional questions regarding a specific tour, please inquire at time of reservation. For your comfort, we recommend packing comfortable walking shoes so you fully enjoy every aspect of your vacation.

Level 1: A very leisurely pace, this tour involves minimal physical activity, such as climbing some stairs, boarding a motorcoach, and walking from the hotel reception area to hotel rooms and dining areas.

Level 2: This tour requires average physical activity. You should be in good health, able to climb stairs and walk reasonable distances, possibly over uneven ground and cobblestone streets.

Level 3: This tour includes moderate physical activity. The itinerary blends some longer days with shorter days and more leisure time. Walking tours, as well as walking slightly longer distances, up stairs or on uneven walking surfaces should be expected.

REVISION FEES

A handling fee of \$25.00 per transaction will be assessed for any change or revision made to a reservation. A change of departure date within 11 months of departure will be treated as a cancellation and cancellation charges will apply.

CANCELLATION CHARGES

Cancellations of confirmed bookings and transfers to new travel dates both result in penalties and fees assessed by travel suppliers. If you have not purchased waivers, and you need to transfer or cancel for any reason prior to tour departure, the following cancellation fees will be assessed on your land or cruise product.
