Day 1: Overnight Flight Travel on an inspirational journey to some of the most fascinating religious sites and relics in the world.

Day 2: Rome, Italy - Tour Begins Your tour opens in Rome. This evening, join your fellow travelers for a special welcome dinner at a popular local restaurant featuring regional delicacies and fine Italian wines. (D)

Day 3: Rome - Assisi Travel north to Assisi. Join a local expert for a fascinating tour of Assisi. Begin at the Church of St. Clare, dedicated to St. Clare, the founder of the Order of Poor Clares, who followed the teachings of St. Francis by living a life of poverty and humility. Kneel before the crucifix from which Jesus spoke to St. Francis, asking him to rebuild his church. Pause to reflect at the Chapel of the Porziuncola, the rose bush, and the cave where the saint prayed. Then we make our way to the huge 13th-century Basilica of St. Francis where you can see many of St. Francis' possessions and a series of frescoes depicting his life. Celebrate Mass before setting out for St. Mary of the Angels Basilica, where St. Francis spent most of his life. (B, D)

Day 4: Assisi - Optional Florence Excursion Enjoy a full day at leisure to

independently explore historic Assisi. Or, if you prefer, join a full day optional excursion to Florence, the "Renaissance City," where a local expert provides a leisurely paced walking tour featuring the Piazza del Duomo, the Cathedral of Santa Maria del Fiore – one of the largest in the Christian world. You also view the Palazzo Vecchio, the Ponte Vecchio, and visit the Church of Santa Croce. Enjoy several hours at leisure in Florence before returning to Assisi. (B)

Day 5: Assisi - Loreto - San Giovanni Rotondo Travel across the Apennine Mountains toward the Adriatic Coast to the Marian Shrine of Loreto. Discover the Holy House of Nazareth and the beautiful Madonna of Loreto where more than 50 popes have made a pilgrimage. You will celebrate Mass before continuing your journey to San Giovanni Rotondo, home of Padre Pio. (B, D)

Day 6: San Giovanni Rotondo - Monte Sant' Angelo - San Giovanni Rotondo Begin your day with a special visit to Monte Sant' Angelo. Take in the breathtaking views of the Gargano Peninsula and explore one of the most celebrated shrines of early Christianity – the Grotto of St. Michael the Archangel. Many popes and saints have knelt and prayed at this grotto, seeking the protection of Saint Michael. Later, return to San Giovanni Rotondo and celebrate Mass in the sanctuary of Padre Pio. This is followed by a tour of the sanctuary, including the old church and the crucifix from which he received the stigmata in 1918, as well as Padre Pio's tomb. Then, visit the new church dedicated in 2004 to Saint Pio of Pietrelcina. You will also see the confessional where Padre Pio spent many hours directing pilgrims on their journey toward God. (B, D)



Day 7: San Giovanni Rotondo - Abbey of Santissima Trinita - Campania Journey through the picturesque landscape of the regions of Apulia and Campania to Cava de Tirreni. Be introduced to the Benedictine Abbey of Santissima Trinita, founded in the 11th century by a local saint. After a guided visit to the abbey, you will have the option of celebrating Mass. (B, D)

Day 8: Campania - Madonna del Rosario - Abbey of Montecassino - Rome Continue your travels to the town of Pompeii where you will visit the Madonna del Rosario Sanctuary, one of the most famous shrines of Christianity. Later, travel to Montecassino to discover the renowned abbey founded by St. Benedict in the 6th century A.D. This sacred place houses the relics of St. Benedict and his sister, Saint Scholastica. Montecassino also became famous during the battles that took place here during World War II, when the abbey was bombed and destroyed. Your day ends in Rome. (B)

Day 9: Rome - Papal Audience - Vatican Museum This morning, attend the weekly papal audience at Vatican City to receive the blessing given



by His Holiness, Pope Francis. Later, visit the Vatican Museum where you will view such historical treasures as the Sistine Chapel and Michelangelo's restored mural of the Last Judgment. Then it's on to the breathtaking St. Peter's Basilica, built on the site where St. Peter was martyred. Known as the grandest of the world's churches, St. Peter's is unsurpassed in beauty. (B)

Day 10: Rome - Christian Rome City Tour Begin your day at the Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls; the remains of St. Paul are located under its main altar.

You'll celebrate Mass here before making your way to the catacombs, where early Christians fearing persecution hid and buried their dead. Continue on to visit the other major Roman basilicas, St. Mary Major and St. John in Lateran, former residences of the popes prior to their return to Rome in 1377. This evening, join your fellow travelers for a farewell dinner celebrating the end of a memorable pilgrimage to Italy. (B, D)

Seek out spiritual renewal on this epic journey

Day 1: Overnight Flight Travel to the Holy Land on an inspirational journey that visits some of the most ancient sites in the world.

Day 2: Tel Aviv, Israel - Tour Begins Your tour begins in Tel Aviv, a bustling city brimming with culture and history, situated on the Israeli Mediterranean coastline. Tonight, join your fellow travelers for a welcome dinner. (D)

Day 3: Tel Aviv - Jaffa - Caesarea - Acre - Nazareth - Cana - Tiberias Journey to the ancient port city of Jaffa for a leisurely stroll through the winding alleys of the historic area. **Celebrate Mass at St. Peter's Church.** Travel to the walled city and Roman ruins of Caesarea. It was here that St. Peter

converted the first pagan, Centurion Cornelius, to become a Christian, and where St. Paul was imprisoned for two years. Next, **stop in Acre**, an ancient crusader city and UNESCO World Heritage site. In Nazareth, visit the Church of the Annunciation. Your day continues with a visit to Cana, the site of Our Lord's first miracle, at a wedding feast where you can renew your marriage vows. Arrive in Tiberias for a 2-night stay. (B, D)

Day 4: Tiberias - Sea of Galilee - Tabgha - Capernaum - Tiberias This morning enjoy a special treat when you **take a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee** where many of the apostles were fishermen and where Our Lord preached. Travel to nearby Tabgha and visit the Church of the Multiplication of the Loaves and the Fishes, built to commemorate the miraculous feeding of five thousand. Stop at the Mount of Beatitudes for a stunning view of the Sea of Galilee. **Celebrate Mass at the Church of the Beatitudes.** Continue to the Church of the Primacy of St. Peter where Our Lord appeared to the apostles after His resurrection. In Capernaum, visit the church built over the ruins of St. Peter's house. Get a taste of the local flavor when you enjoy lunch at a communal settlement known as a kibbutz. Finally, visit Yardenit, the Jordan River baptismal site. (B, L, D)

Day 5: Tiberias - Mount Tabor - Bethlehem - Jerusalem Travel to Mount Tabor,

the site of the Transfiguration. **Proceed to Bethlehem** and enjoy a stop at Shepherds' Field, where the angels appeared on the first Christmas night. **Celebrate Mass at the Church of the Nativity**, built on the birth site of Our Lord. Later, arrive in one of the holiest cities in the world, Jerusalem. (B, D)

Day 6: Jerusalem, the Old City Your visit to Jerusalem begins with a visit to the Church of the Pater Noster, built on the traditional site where Jesus taught His disciples the Lord's Prayer; its name refers to the "Our Father" prayer. Next, **visit the Mount of Olives** and the site where Our Lord wept over the city, now known as Dominus Flevit. Afterwards, visit the Church of All Nations, built over the rock on which Our Lord

prayed the night before He was crucified. Continue to the Garden of Gethsemane, the site of Christ's betrayal by Judas. Travel to Caiaphas' Palace – known today as St. Peter in Gallicantu – where St. Peter once denied Our Lord in one of its courts. This afternoon, **travel to Ein Karem to visit the Church of St. John the Baptist**, built over the Grotto of his birthplace, and celebrate Mass. (B, D)

Day 7: Jerusalem Today you are free to explore the city on your own. Perhaps you'll choose to take an optional excursion to the Dead Sea to discover where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found; visit Masada; stop at AHAVA Visitors Center; and perhaps even float on the salty waters of the Dead Sea. Later today, gather with your fellow travelers to celebrate Mass. (B, D)

Day 8: Jerusalem - Western Wall Enter the old city through St. Stephen's Gate where St. Stephen, the first Christian martyr, was stoned to death. Continue to the Church of St. Anne, marking the place where the parents of the Blessed Mother lived. Visit the nearby Pools of Bethesda, where Jesus healed the paralytic, and see the Ecce Homo Arch, the site where Pontius Pilate presented Our Lord to the crowds. **Celebrate Mass at the Church of the Holy Sepulchre**, the site of His crucifixion, burial and resurrection.

Walk through the Muslim, Christian and Jewish quarters to the Western Wall of the Temple. Then, **follow the Via Dolorosa**, the Way of the Cross, walked by Our Lord on the way to His crucifixion. Next, visit the Church of the Dormition (commemorating Our Lady's Assumption) and the nearby Hall of the Last Supper. In Jerusalem, enjoy a farewell dinner with your fellow travelers to celebrate the end of this unforgettable and holy experience. (B, D)

Enjoy more time in this lively capital known as the "fair city."

Call for details.

Day 1: Overnight Flight Discover the most revered sites of the Emerald Isle. Visit Dublin, Westport, Galway and Belfast as you experience Ireland's natural beauty, rich history and religious heritage.

Day 2: Dublin, Ireland - Tour Begins Arrive in the "Fair City" of Dublin, Ireland's historic capital city. Begin your tour with a visit to Ireland's oldest pub – The Brazen Head. Join your fellow travelers for a fun-filled welcome dinner and toast the start to an incredible journey. (D)

Day 3: Dublin Celebrate Mass this morning. Then, join your local guide for a sightseeing tour of Dublin, featuring a tour of St. Patrick's Cathedral, the spiritual heart of the city. See O'Connell Street, Grafton Street and the city's magnificent rows of stately Georgian town homes. Afterwards, enter the scholarly grounds of

Trinity College to view the *Book of Kells*, one of medieval Ireland's religious masterpieces. Spend the remainder of the day at leisure; relax or explore the cultural and spiritual offerings of delightful Dublin on your own. (B)

Day 4: Dublin - Kilbeggan - Clonmacnoise - Westport Embark on a cross-country journey pausing along the way in Irish whiskey territory. The ancient towns of Tullamore and Kilbeggan have long been associated with the whiskey industry. Dive into the art of whiskey-making and enjoy a tasting of the final product during a visit to one of these historic distilleries. Continue to the stirring ruins of Clonmacnoise, once one of Ireland's most prominent monastic settlements. Tour the abandoned monastery and learn about the great Celtic Christian tradition of the Irish. Finally, settle into your hotel to begin a relaxing 3-night stay in the charming coastal town of Westport. (B, D)

Day 5: Westport - Knock Shrine - Galway - Westport Today you have a chance to worship at the Marian Shrine of Knock. Here, on August 21, 1879, fifteen witnesses saw an apparition of the Blessed Virgin with Saint John and Saint Joseph. The revered site of this vision is visited by 1.5 million pilgrims each year. Pope Saint John Paul II worshipped at the Shrine in 1979 to mark the centenary of the



St. Patrick's Cathedral

vision. After this moving experience we travel to Galway, the "City of Tribes." Following a brief tour, enjoy some time at leisure to peruse Galway's historic streets and local shops. (B)

Day 6: Westport - Croagh Patrick - Kylemore Abbey - Westport Spend time this morning at Croagh Patrick, St. Patrick's holy mountain. It is on this mountain's iconic summit that St. Patrick fasted for forty days in the 5th century. Next, we set off for Kylemore Abbey, a stunning Benedictine monastery founded in 1920 by nuns fleeing Belgium during World War I. Explore the Abbey and its historic Victorian Walled Garden, restored by the Benedictine community. Return



to Westport for an evening at leisure. Perhaps you'll choose to enjoy live music at one of the many historic pubs in town. (B)

Day 7: Westport - Tobermalt - Belleek - Belfast Leave Westport behind for Tobermalt Holy Well, one of Ireland's truly hidden gems. At this serene spot, enjoy time to pray and reflect. During Penal times, this was a place of refuge for Ireland's Catholic community to celebrate Mass. Travel to Belleek Pottery, known internationally for its highly decorative Parian china. Tour the factory and learn how these original pieces are made using traditional methods passed down from generation to generation. Later, arrive in Belfast, Northern Ireland's largest city. (B, D)

Day 8: Belfast Start your day with a guided tour of Belfast. Learn about the city's struggles as you pass through several distinctive neighborhoods. See "Samson" and "Goliath," the massive cranes at the shipyard that built the legendary *Titanic*. This evening, celebrate a Vigil Mass at St. Peter's Cathedral in Belfast. (B)

Day 9: Belfast - Downpatrick - Armagh - Dublin Depart Belfast for "Saint Patrick's country." Your first stop is

at the medieval Down Cathedral, the burial place of St. Patrick. A place of meditation and worship, this building has become a symbol of the Irish people's deep connection to the past. Then, explore St. Patrick Centre in Downpatrick, detailing the life and history of Ireland's patron saint. **A privately guided tour of St. Patrick's first church in Ireland at Saul** reveals the story of his death on March 17th. Continue on to the county town of Armagh, seat of the Archbishop of both the Roman Catholic Church and the Church of Ireland. This evening, gather with your fellow travelers for a farewell dinner. (B, D)

Day 10: Dublin - Tour Ends Head home with many incredible memories. (B)

Day 2: Tel Aviv, Israel - Tour Begins Your tour begins in Tel Aviv, a bustling city brimming with culture and history, situated on the Israeli Mediterranean coastline. Tonight, join your fellow travelers for a welcome dinner. (D)

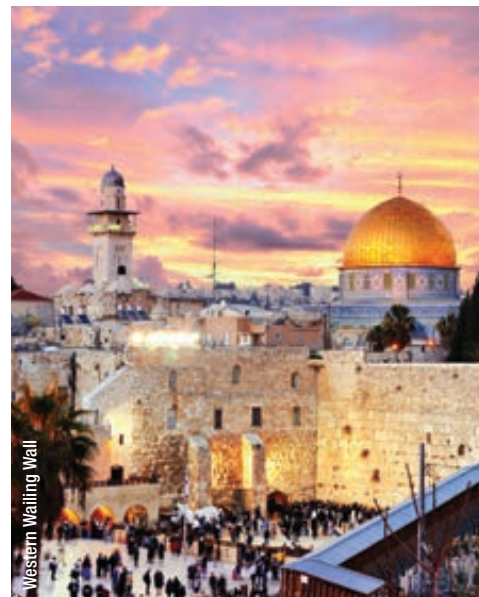
Day 3: Tel Aviv - Jaffa - Caesarea - Acre - Nazareth - Cana - Tiberias Journey to the ancient port city of Jaffa for a leisurely stroll through the winding alleys of the historic area. Visit the Roman Aqueduct and Theatre at Caesarea, a center of the early Christians where Cornelius became the first Gentile convert to the new covenant (Acts 10) by St. Peter; and where Paul was imprisoned before being taken to Rome for trial (Acts 23). Stop in Acre, an ancient crusader city and UNESCO World Heritage site. **In Nazareth, Jesus' boyhood home (Matthew 2:23), visit the Church of the Annunciation** and the place where Joseph's home and workshop were as well as the site of the fresh water spring used by the Holy Family. Your day continues with a visit to Cana, the site of Our Lord's first miracle. Arrive in Tiberias for a 2-night stay. (B, D)

Day 4: Sea of Galilee - Capernaum - Golan Heights - Caesarea Philippi - Tiberias Cross the waters of the Sea of Galilee aboard a replica of the boat in which Jesus would have sailed. Travel to the Mount of Beatitudes where Jesus preached the "Sermon on the Mount" (Matthew 5-7).

Nearby Tabgha is the traditional location for the calling of the disciples and the feeding of the five thousand. Visit the Church of the Fish and the Loaves (Luke 9:10-17). In Capernaum, Jesus performed many miracles and it was the center of Jesus' ministry in Galilee. Visit the synagogue that stands on the site where Jesus taught and reflect on his teaching and preaching of the gospel of the kingdom (Matthew 4:13, 23). Visit the Chapel of the Primacy where Peter professed his devotion to the risen Christ (John 21) on three occasions. Get a taste of the local flavor when you enjoy lunch at a communal settlement, known as a kibbutz, in the Golan Heights. Visit Caesarea Philippi, where Jesus traveled with His disciples and near where Peter made his great confession to Jesus, "Thou art the Christ, the Son of the living God" (Matthew 16:16). Your day ends at the River Jordan at the Yardenit Baptismal site. (B, L, D)

Day 5: Tiberias - Tel Megiddo - Bethlehem - Jerusalem Visit Tel Megiddo (Armageddon), the site of the final battle before the coming of the Messiah. **In Bethlehem, the birthplace of Jesus (Luke 2), enter the Church of the Nativity**, the oldest continuously functioning church in the world. View the cave where Jesus was born. Stop at Shepherds' Field, where the angels appeared on that first Christmas night, spreading good tidings of great joy for all the people. Later, arrive in one of the holiest cities in the world, Jerusalem. (B, D)

Day 6: Jerusalem - Mount Zion - Ein Karem Your time in Jerusalem begins with a visit to the Mount of Olives. Afterwards, visit the Church of the Pater Noster, built on the traditional site where Christ taught the Lord's Prayer; its name refers to the "Our

Father" prayer. Continue to the Church of All Nations, built over the rock on which Our Lord prayed the night before He was crucified. Nearby is the Tomb of the Virgin Mary and the Garden of Gethsemane, the site of Christ's betrayal by Judas. Travel to Mount Zion and stand in the Upper Room, near the traditional site of the Last Supper (Mark 14). Then, continue to Ein Karem, the birthplace of John the Baptist and the place to which Mary traveled to share her good news with Elizabeth. (B, D)

Day 7: Jerusalem Today you are free to explore the city on your own. Perhaps you'll choose to take an optional excursion to the Dead Sea to discover where

the Dead Sea Scrolls were found; visit Masada; and perhaps even float on the salty waters of the Dead Sea. (B, D)

His crucifixion; pass by the Ecce Homo Arch, the site where Pontius Pilate presented Our Lord to the crowds. Next, visit the Western Wall of the Temple before stopping at the Garden Tomb, the possible site of the garden of Joseph of Arimathea and site of the resurrection of Jesus. An epic journey delving into the history of the Reformation

Day 1: Overnight Flight Embark on an inspirational journey through Germany that follows the epic trail blazed by Martin Luther, marking the 500th anniversary of the day of the Reformation.

Day 2: Mainz, Germany - Tour Begins Your tour opens in the enchanting city of Mainz, a medieval town located on the banks of the Rhine River. Tonight, meet your fellow travelers during a welcome dinner. (D)

Day 3: Mainz - Worms - Mainz Begin your day with a visit to the Gutenberg Museum where you can see a copy of Gutenberg's masterpiece — the 42-line Bible. Enjoy free time to explore the town before traveling to Worms. It was in Worms that the Imperial Diet (Assembly) passed judgment on Luther after his refusal to recant. Day 4: Mainz - Erfurt Today you travel to Erfurt which Martin Luther himself referred to as the "City of Towers," no doubt due to its numerous steeples. Arriving in Erfurt, embark on a walking tour of the city, passing over Merchants' Bridge on your way to the Augustinian monastery. **Enjoy a tour of the monastery, where Luther lived and studied as a monk from 1505 to 1512.** After your tour, you are invited to a prayer service in St. Augustine's church inside the monastery. (B, D)

Day 5: Erfurt - Eisenach - Wartburg Castle - Erfurt This morning we travel to Eisenach to explore another central town in Luther's life. Your tour of the area begins with a visit to Wartburg Castle, where Luther translated the Bible. Step into what is now "Luther's Room," where Luther lived during the many months he spent at the castle. Our next stop is at the Bachhaus Eisenach to enjoy a musical performance played on various historical instruments dating back to Bach's time. Next, join a local guide for a walking tour of the town. You will see the Lutherhaus Eisenach, where Luther resided as a child, and St. George's Church, where he was a choir boy. Enjoy time to explore independently. Return to Erfurt in the late afternoon. (B)

Day 6: Erfurt - Eisleben - Dresden Begin your day with a visit to Eisleben, the site of Luther's birth and death. Delve into his life as we visit the museum inside the home where he was born; St. Peter and Paul Church where he was baptized; and St. Andrews Church

where he performed his final sermons. Next, continue on to Dresden, your home for the next two nights. **This evening, get a true taste of the region when dining in a local cellar restaurant.** (B, D)

Day 7: Dresden This morning, join a local guide for a tour of this historical city. See the old town square, the royal residence castle and the Frauenkirche (Church of Our Lady). Enjoy ample time to explore this lovely town on the banks of the River Elbe. (B)

Day 8: Dresden - Leipzig - Wittenberg This morning, travel to Leipzig, a city touched by musical greatness. Day 9: Wittenberg Set out on a guided tour of Wittenberg. Your first stop is the former Wittenberg University where Luther served as a professor of theology. Next, explore his family home on the grounds; today it is a fascinating museum housing his writings and other artifacts from the Reformation. Travel back in time as you discover its seemingly untouched rooms used by Luther. **Continue to the oldest structure in the city, St. Mary's Church, where Luther preached, was married, and where his children were baptized.** See the Castle Church, the location where the famous 95 Theses were posted, launching

Frequently Asked Questions

Accommodations

What is the difference between a twin room and a double room?

In certain countries, hotel rooms tend to be smaller than U.S. standard accommodations. A double room is designed to accommodate two people, but may not have two separate beds. A twin bedded room has two separate beds of any size, and is the type most commonly utilized.

What size is a triple room? A triple room is the same size as a twin bedded room and beds will accommodate three people, but we cannot guarantee that there will be three separate beds. If there are only two beds, a rollaway may be requested but cannot be guaranteed due to size of room and fire codes. Please inquire at time of reservation.

Can my children travel on tour? Children over the age of 5 may travel on a Collette tour accompanied by an adult. Child land rates are valid for ages 5-12, sharing a room with two full-paying adults.

Are single and triple rooms always available? On many tours, triple and single accommodations are limited and are available on a first come, first served basis. Be advised that single rooms are often smaller.

When can I check into my hotel? Normal check-in time is late afternoon in most locations. Due to early arrival times into some cities, rooms may not always be available for immediate check-in.

Air

Can Collette book our airline reservations? Collette is happy to assist you in accommodating your flight needs. Due to tour scheduling and limited availability, you are strongly encouraged to take advantage of Collette's air packages. We are not responsible for air arrangements you have made on your own. On occasion, it is necessary to change tour dates. In this case, we can only protect air reservations booked through Collette. For all air reservations, it is strongly recommended to reconfirm flights before departure, in the event that the airline has an unexpected schedule change. We cannot assume responsibility for schedule changes, routings or flight cancellations involving the airlines. Not all airlines offer pre-assigned seats. Some charge a fee for seats which will be at the guests' expense. Where pre-assigned seats are not offered, the guests must contact the airline directly to arrange seat assignments.

Attractions & Sightseeing

Are attractions always available? Access to some attractions or Collette Foundation sites may be affected by the observance of holidays, weather conditions or other circumstances. As a result, the days and order of sightseeing may change to best utilize your time on tour. Boat rides are weather permitting. Some attractions may not be available during the "off-season" months. When attractions are unavailable, other similar attractions will be substituted. Wildlife sightings are not guaranteed.

Is there a lot of walking on tour? We pride ourselves on bringing travelers the very best experiences a destination offers. Our itineraries include many activities and may consist of walking on uneven terrain or significant walking at times. Some of the most unique sightseeing can mean accessing locations that restrict motorcoaches, especially in historic areas. Some hotels/lodges in remote locations may not have elevators. For your comfort, we recommend bringing walking shoes. Review each tour's "Tour Activity Level" and "Tour Pacing" for details.

Can you tell me more about the safaris? In order to most fully experience the wildlife, you will be traveling by custom-built safari vehicle which requires climbing in and out frequently and sometimes travels on bumpy roads. To experience Africa fully, we recommend that all travelers be in reasonably good health and prepare properly.

How can I plan for shore landings? Special clothing is required for the shore landings (Antarctica, Galapagos); please refer to your predeparture documents for important details.

Are all theater performances suitable for children? Some theater performances may be unsuitable for children – consult your tour manager.

Documentation

Do I need a passport? Government-issued identification is required for all air travel. A valid passport is required for all trips outside the USA. All passengers should check with the appropriate foreign consulate for entry and validity requirements. We recommend that your passport has six months validity, and at least 3 blank pages. Passports and visas are the responsibility of each client.

International Borders Any child under age 16 (traveling without a parent or legal guardian to Canada) must have written permission from a parent or legal guardian.

Please be advised that if you have been convicted of an offense, or have committed a criminal act that is an offense under the laws where it occurred and would be an offense in Canada, you may be inadmissible into Canada. You will need to apply for a Minister's Permit of Approval of Rehabilitation at a Canadian Consulate. All other travelers should contact the appropriate consulate for entry requirements in other international destinations.

In South Africa, children are required to have a passport as well as additional documentation to travel with you into and out of the country. Please consult the South African Embassy for the current specific requirements related to your travel dates.

If traveling internationally with a child under the age of 18, please check directly with the airline for the legal documentation that is required. It is the sole responsibility of the guest to procure the proper documentation to travel and many requirements vary by airline and destination. Collette will not be responsible for costs incurred for missed flights or canceled tours where a guest fails to secure proper documentation.

Extending Your Stay

Can I extend my tour to see more of a region? Yes! You may enhance your tour by purchasing either an extension or pre/post hotel stays, offered on select tours. Extensions may be "hosted" rather than escorted. When hosted, passengers will be greeted upon arrival by a local tour manager who will provide all included services and be available on-call during the duration of the extension. A minimum number of passengers may be required to operate some extensions. Extensions not purchased at time of deposit are subject to availability and applicable charges at time of request.

Collette also offers pre and post hotel nights before and/or after a tour for you to explore the destination independently. Should you purchase additional nights, please be advised that your tour manager will not be available during this time.

What is not included in the tour price? The land price does not include air travel, airline fees, airport or departure taxes, transfers, visas, customary end-of-trip gratuities for your Tour Manager, driver, local guides, hotel housekeepers, cruise ship waitstaff, and any incidental charges.

Late Bookings

How can I be best prepared for the pacing and physical requirements on a Collette tour? Tour pacing varies by itinerary, and each destination's sightseeing and activities are unique. Pacing is subject to personal interpretation. At Collette, we do include the best a destination has to offer, enhancing your overall tour experience. For overnight pacing of a tour, please refer to the "Accommodations" section on each tour page and on the tour map. These describe the number of nights you will stay in each hotel during your tour. The day-by-day descriptions will provide additional detail about the number of activities included in each day.

The Tour Activity Level Ranking is featured on each tour itinerary in a circle. The definition of each activity level is listed here. If you have additional questions regarding a specific tour, please inquire at time of reservation. For your comfort, we recommend packing comfortable walking shoes so you can fully enjoy every aspect of your tour.

Level 1: At a very leisurely pace, this tour involves minimal physical activity, such as climbing some stairs, boarding a motorcoach, and walking from the hotel reception area to hotel rooms and dining areas.

Level 2: This tour requires average physical activity. You should be in good health, able to climb stairs and walk reasonable distances, possibly over uneven ground and cobblestoned streets.

Level 3: This tour includes moderate physical activity. The itinerary blends some longer days with shorter days and more leisure time. Walking tours, as well as walking slightly longer distances, up stairs or on uneven walking surfaces should be expected.

Level 4: To truly experience the program and destination, you need to be able to participate in physical activities such as longer walking tours, walking over uneven terrain, climbing stairs and periods of standing. Some of the touring days may be longer, with select included activities occurring later in the evening.

Level 5: This tour is very active, requiring participants to be physically fit to fully enjoy all the experiences. Revision Fees

A handling fee of \$25.00 per transaction will be assessed for any change or revision made to a reservation. A change of departure date within 11 months of departure will be treated as a cancellation, and cancellation charges will apply.

Cancellation Charges
