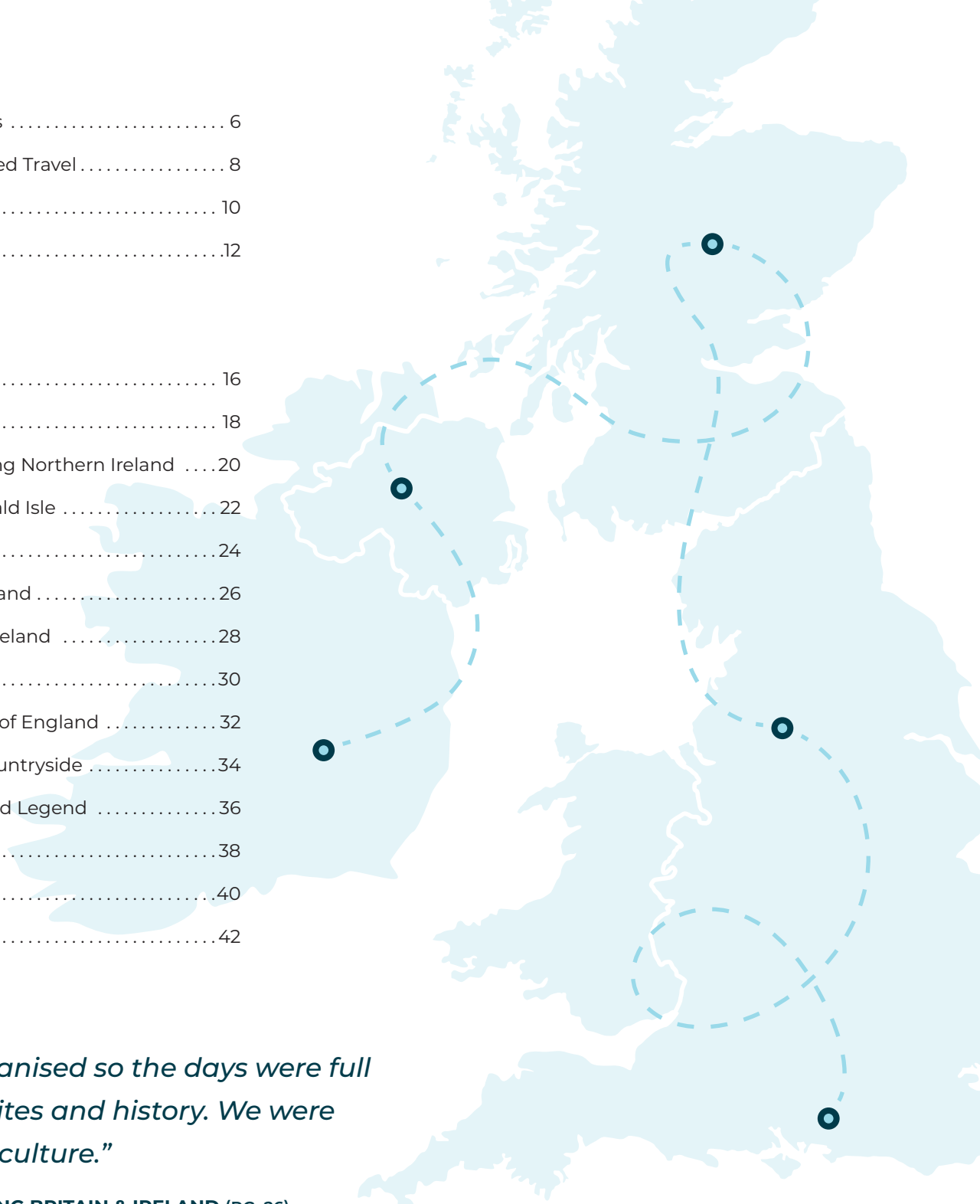

Days 1–2 | Dublin

- Meet the locals and cheers to your journey at a local restaurant in Dublin.

Days 1–2 | Dublin
