ITINERARY HIGHLIGHTS

Days 1, 2 | Boston, Lexington, Concord


Days 6–9 | Washington, D.C., Arlington, Mount Vernon

ITINERARY HIGHLIGHTS

Days 1, 2 | Washington, D.C.

Days 1–3 | Providence, Newport

- Cruise to the idyllic island of Nantucket and visit the Whaling Museum to learn about the island's history as the former whaling capital of the world.
- Relax and take advantage of the amenities at your waterfront hotel **-OR-** visit the Heritage Museums & Gardens and Sandwich Glass Museum with your Tour Manager.

- Ferry to beautiful Martha's Vineyard, a favorite summer home to artists, writers, celebrities, and politicians. Explore the island's highlights, including its colorful "gingerbread" cottages and whaling port.
